- 3.—For the March to the Cenotaph the parade will be formed in three columns moving eight abreast as under:—
 - (i) Blue Berets (Relatives), Parties K, M, and Y, from Parliament Square (South Side), led by the Band of the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery.
 - (ii) Khaki Berets (ex-Service Men) Parties K, L, M, O, Y, and BP, from Old Palace Yard, led by the Band of the Welsh Guards.
 - (iii) Blue Berets (Relatives), Parties L, O, and BP, from Parliament Square (North Side), led by the Canadian Scottish Pipers.

A distance of 200 yards will be kept between (i) and (ii), and (ii) and (iii) on the march.

4.—Route.—St. Margaret Street—Parliament Street—Whitehall.

5.—On Arrival at the Cenotaph:—

Column (i) will form Mass on the North Side of the Cenotaph and when halted will turn about to face the Cenotaph.

Column (ii) will form line (8 deep) on both sides of the road, turning inwards to face the Cenotaph when halted.

Column (iii) will form Mass on the South Side of the Cenotaph.

NOTE:—In every case Companies will be led into their places by their Company Commander, as directed by the Parade Marshals or Assistant Parade Marshals.

6.--Order for Standards. Parade, New Palace Yard, 10 a.m.

NOTE—All Standards and Colours will take their time from the Headquarters' Union Jack. Standards will fall in at the "Order." They will March off at the "Carry," and remain at the "Carry" throughout the Service, except that

They will "Dip" on first note of "Last Post" remaining down till the first note of "Reveille" when they will return to the "Carry."

They will again "Dip" on first note of National Anthem and remain down till the Close, when they will return to the "Carry" and remain at the Carry" during the march to Westminster Abbey.

- 7.—Dress.—Lounge Suit will be worn, with beret, medals and Pilgrimage Badge.
- 8.—Bands.—Bands accompanying the columns from the Parade Grounds to Whitehall must cease playing on approaching the Cenotaph. By kind permission of the Officer Commanding, the Band of H.M. Welsh Guards will march the ex-Service contingent to the Cenotaph and will accompany the Service.
- 9.—For those unable to take part in the short march necessary a position will be reserved on the pavement in front of the Home Office.

PART II:—Dismissal.

- 10.—On conclusion of the Service the Parade will stand fast, while the Guards' Band, Clergy, Standards and the Special Party for Westminster Abbey move off. Route, Parliament Square—Broad Sanctuary.
- 11.—The Parade will then proceed to the Horse Guards' Parade Ground in Column of Fours in the following order: Band of the Canadian Pipers, Blue Beret Detachments, followed at a distance of 200 yards by the Khaki Beret Detachment, headed by the Band of the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery.
- 12.—Route.—The March will be via Whitehall—Horse Guards' Arch—to the Horse Guards' Parade Ground, where the Parade will be formed up facing the Horse Guards' Arch for dismissal.
